Aiko Doden is a journalist and a researcher at Johns Hopkins University, and a Japan Foundation Indo-Pacific Partnership Program Fellow. Until 2024, she was a Senior Commentator on international affairs and a presenter at NHK, Japan's public broadcaster. She has expertise in reporting and commenting on a wide range of issues from hard security to human security. Her focus is international affairs with a focus on Southeast Asia and Japan in the context of Indo-Pacific strategy. She was a correspondent in Thailand covering ASEAN countries.

Ms Doden serves on the board of trustees at Thomson Reuters Founders Share Company, and is a governing board member, UNESCO MGIEP, Mahatma Gandhi Institute for Education for Peace. SOAS, the School of Oriental and African Studies at the University of London, appointed her to be the Professor of Practice at the Department of Politics and International Studies in 2023.
